Please join us for the final event **for Read Together Diamond Bar 2023 on Saturday, November 18 at 2 p.m.** Crime fiction author Carl Vonderau will be the guest speaker at the **Diamond Bar Library Windmill Room.** Mr. Vonderau will discuss his new book *Saving Myles*. Mr. Vonderau is the President of Partners in Crime, the San Diego chapter of Sisters in Crime.

The three winners of the annual student **Essay Writing Contest: How a Book Changed My Life** will be awarded at that time. Each winner will receive a \$300 prize. This annual event is always interesting and inspirational as we hear from Mr. Vonderau and also the three winners of the essay contest.

Read Together Diamond Bar is based on the concept of One City, One Book where everyone in the community is suggested to read one book based on universal themes and then come together to discuss and participate with many interesting book discussions and various activities in the library.

What's New at the Library?


October was Banned Books Week (October 1-7) which is not something to celebrate but to recognize. We can celebrate the fact that your Library is standing strong in support of the freedom to read, to explore and to express oneself, to have free access to a spectrum of information, ideas, and other resources, building understanding about oneself and others. The Library's newest initiative is **Books Unbanned**. This initiative will provide a Books Unbanned Card to any teen (13-18) throughout California, giving them free access to the Library's digital collection.

The Library Foundation will add to the Library's collection, with e-books and e-audiobooks that cover a range of topics and genres, including books that are banned. The Library and Foundation are joining a national movement, started by the Brooklyn Public Library and San Diego Public Library.

In 2022, The American Library Association (ALA) documented 1,269 demands to censor library books and resources, the highest number of attempted book bans since ALA began compiling data about

censorship in libraries more than 20 years ago. Most of these censorship attempts targeted books for a teen audience and were by or about Black or LGBTQIA+ persons.

Reading and accessing a wide variety of content can help open hoors and create opportunities for people to advance their education and careers. It also helps people obtain unfiltered information that they can use to thoughtfully contribute to civil discourse on a range of complex topics, such as the right to vote, the environment, and the history and origins of inequities in society.
